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Understanding China Series Event 4 ÒPolicy Storms: Understanding ChinaÕs Educati Market & State Through Recent Policy Chánges

In recent years and especially in 2021, new, strict regulations promulgated by the Chinese governmer hammered a number of industries, such as education merce, real estated even entertainment These policy changes have proven detrimental to the strong rowth of the foprofit supplemental education industry, and are likely to have profound consequences for the Chinese economy and socie general. This presentation draws on these policy charge strong conditions in China Õs education, market and state sectors.

Xiaojun Wang is an Associate Professor of Economics at UHM. His main research interests fall into the broad field of labor economs, and recently have used on labor market transitions during ChinaÕs reform era.
